

Amparo González Sola Gestures as portals

10 September—5 October, 2025 Marres, Maastricht

Gestures as portals is an ongoing performance by choreographer and dancer Amparo González Sola. The month-long research project takes place during the dismantling of the exhibition *Vultures & Fireflies* by artist Alejandro Galván. Let your presence become part of the unfolding work and encounter the performer in a house where remnants of the exhibition remain visible, alongside traces of its deconstruction and empty spaces.

Gestures are central to González Sola's practice, they create a moving vocabulary full of meaning, based on the interactions of the performers, visitors, staff, and the previous exhibition. The work evolves daily, allowing the choreographic materials—and the space itself—to transform gradually through repetition, presence, and interaction.

The performance emerges from the growing sense of distance in a world where a relentless stream of horrific events is projected onto our screens, numbing our emotional capacity. How close does something need to happen before we experience a connection or a sense of responsibility?

Unfolding through While Taking Shape

Amparo González Sola resumes the questions and choreographic methods explored in *While Taking Shape*, extending them into a durational, site-responsive format. *While Taking Shape* premiered at SPRING Performing Arts Festival 2025.
